Items that sell well:

- High quality items
- Name brand items
- Quality kitchen items
- French Provincial furniture
- Mid-century (Eames era) anything
- Garage items (tools, lawn equipment)
- Outdoor furniture
- Jewelry (costume and fine)
- Older kitchen items (Pyrex, Fire King, older items)
- Pantry items
- Cell phones



Items that do not usually sell well

- Ceramic coffee cups & mugs with company logos (exception Starbucks)
- Area rugs
- Framed art
- Office chairs
- Inexpensive figurines
- Inexpensive and or common Christmas and holiday décor (Michaels, Hobby Lobby)
- Dollar Store / Dollar Tree / Dollar General / Big Lots / As seen on TV items
- Miscellaneous hardware (random nuts & bolts, screws, nails)

Items that can be thrown away or given away / will realize little if any money

- Household products nearly empty (nearly full or full are good)
- Chipped or previously repaired items (china, figurines, dishes, glassware, etc.)
- Clothing with stains, rips, holes, threadbare or ring-around-the-collar
- T-shirts or clothing from a trade convention, summer camp, or specific company
- Linens in poor condition (thread bare, stains, holes). Older, good condition are fine
- Food storage containers: disposable, stained/damaged, top only or bottom only
- Antiquated wiring (telephone cords, stereo cords, old computer cords, power cords and adaptors that do not match anything)
- Home telephone systems
